**NOTICE OF CASE CLOSURE**

On February 1, 2024, the State Elections Enforcement Commission docketed this complaint based on alleged potential election law violations within its jurisdiction.

At its March 20, 2024, meeting, after preliminary investigation, the Commission determined on the record that it was not necessary to further investigate this matter pursuant to General Statutes § 9-7b (a) (1).

Assuming the facts of the complaint to be true, the mere fact that the potential named Respondent remained at a caucus, despite the change in her party affiliation on her voter registration being too recent for rights of the party to accrue to her, does not serve as a sufficient basis for further investigation based on an alleged violation of General Statutes § 9-396. General Statutes § 9-396 sets the parameters for voting and participating in a caucus.

The Commission therefore administratively closes this matter.
